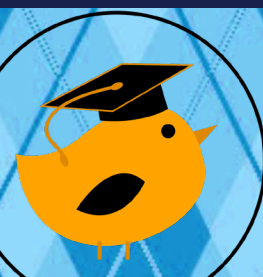

# About This Pack

This pack includes activities, games, and worksheets for the phoneme /j/, spellings j, g, ge, dge. There are activities for single-syllable and multisyllabic words. The following pages provide master word lists for all words used in this pack.

There are three main sections.

## 1. Posters and word cards

This section includes posters for each of the different spellings for both single-syllable and multisyllabic words. Use the posters for display in your classroom and fluency practice. Enlarge the posters to A3 (ledger) size and then laminate them for durability.

There are word cards (for single-syllable and multisyllabic words) that you can use for sorting activities, games, reading practice, or add them to your sound wall (or word wall).

## 2. Single-syllable worksheets and games

There are 20 worksheets and activities and 5 games. Use the worksheets for independent practice, word work centers, and morning work. The games are ideal for partner work, small group instruction, and literacy centers.

## 3. Multisyllabic worksheets and games

There are 19 worksheets and activities for multisyllabic words and 5 games. The activities and games are perfect for word work centers, whole-class review, small group instruction, or intervention.
