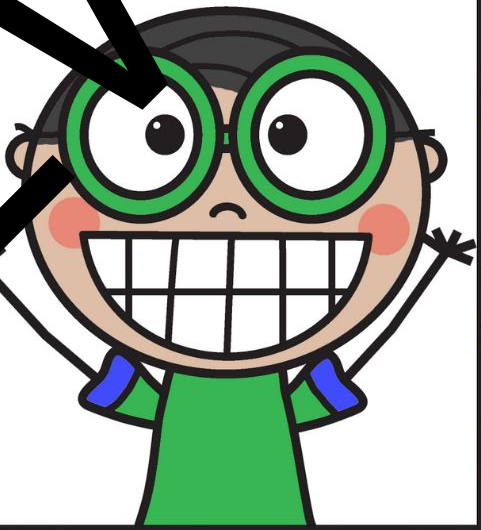

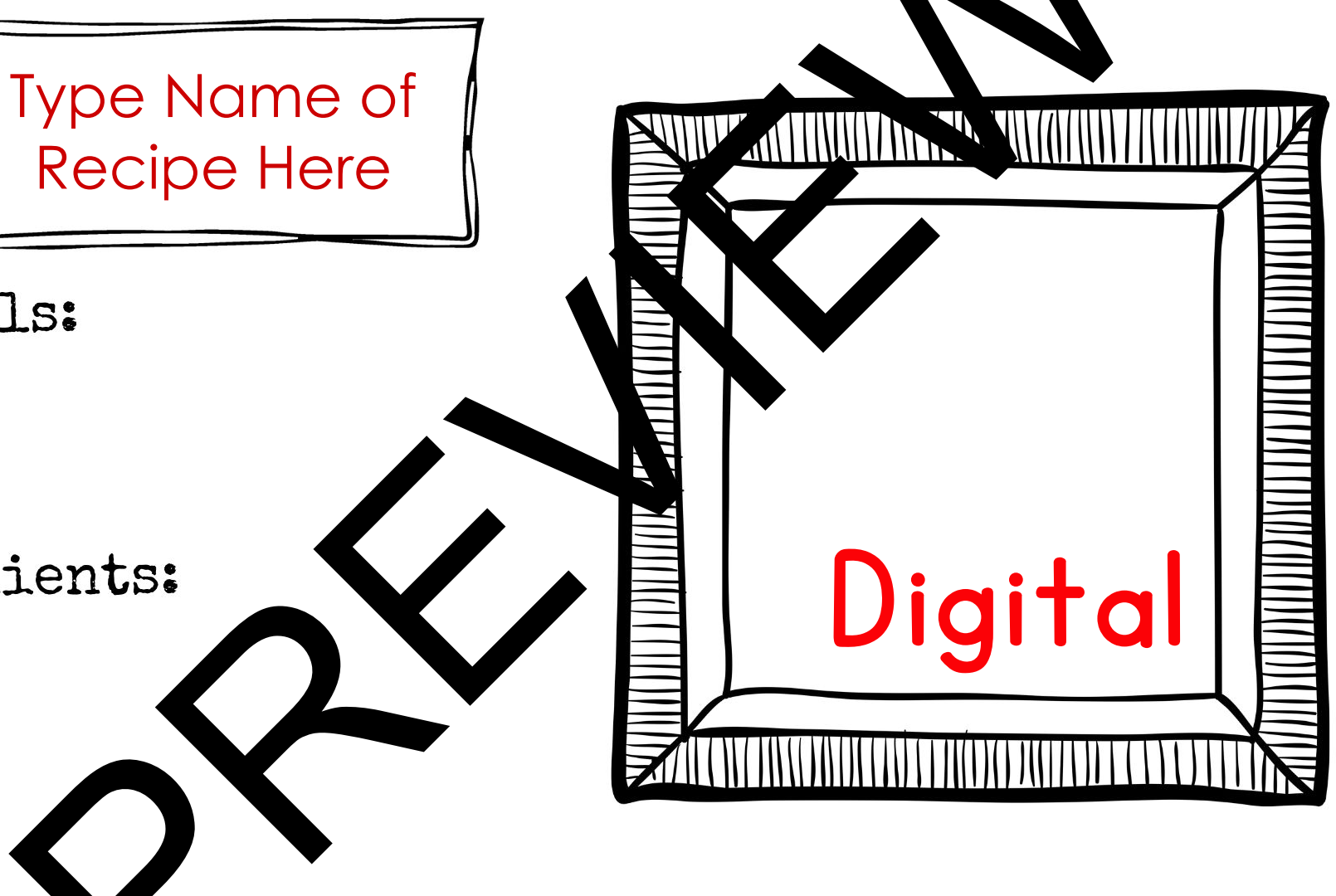

About This Pack

Sometimes students find it challenging to begin writing when staring at a blank piece of paper. These writing prompts are a way for students to start the writing process in a structured way.

The writing prompts in this pack include a specific phonics sound. Each prompt provides a list of single-syllable and multisyllabic words with the phoneme focus of /oy/. The words contain the spelling <oy>. The following page provides a list of all the words used in the prompts.

Students are required to incorporate the words provided on the prompt in their writing. Not only does the word bank help students with phonics and spelling, but it also helps to provide ideas for writing.
