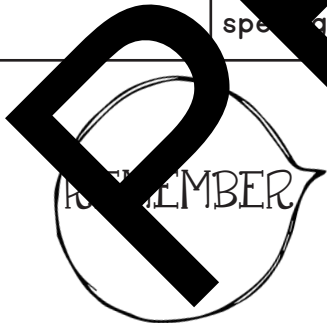

You will need lined paper or a book for this activity. When you have finished writing, read the sentence aloud. Check your spelling.
